



## A bond of ballet, opera & The Met

If you enjoy stories with a surprise, keep reading.

**Don and Anna Marie Garrigan**, Friends Homes West residents since 2015, moved to Greensboro from Scottsdale, Ariz., to be closer to their three children, all of whom live on the East Coast. Both Don and Anna Marie grew up in New York City, and they share a love of music. In fact, Don's father played the piano by ear and his mother took voice lessons as a young girl.

Growing up in upper Manhattan, Don and his brother, **Gerald**, went to shows and theatres as often as they could – usually up in the “nosebleed section,” as Don likes to say. Don especially enjoyed the Metropolitan Opera, which he refers to as the “old Met on 39th and Broadway.”

**Giacomo Puccini's** *La Boheme* is the first opera he can remember seeing there, but he has also enjoyed *Daughter of the Regiment* with **Lily Pons**, *Carmen*, *Don Giovanni*, and others, saving as many of the programs and playbills as possible.

After five and a half years in the Navy and an honorable discharge in 1946, Don returned to the Met to see Wagner's *Tannhauser*. He kept the program for the 1945-46 season, then resumed his hobby of attending as many shows as possible, on Broadway or at other theatres. His brother, Gerald, attended acting school in New York, pursuing a career in the theatre with performances off Broadway. Gerald, now retired, lives in a community similar

to FHW in New York, and is still involved in community theatre.

When Don and Anna Marie moved to FHW, he made the decision to discard his collection of brochures and programs. “I had so many,” he said, “and I couldn't keep them all.” But he kept his love of opera. So in 2016 he rode with a group of other residents on the activity bus to UNCG's Aycock Auditorium to see the Greensboro Opera's production of *Carmen*, and found himself at the intermission chatting with fellow resident, **Elissa Fuchs**, whom he had just met. They discovered a shared interest – passion, really – of opera, ballet, and the theatre in general, and then Elissa told him about her career spent in ballet. She had danced in *Carmen* at the Met, she told him. And others. Many others. Including *Tannhauser* in 1946.

The next day, keeping his fingers crossed, Don looked for, and found – you

guessed it – his saved program from the Metropolitan Opera's 1945-46 season, which had somehow escaped being thrown away with so many other pieces of memorabilia. And there, under “ACT 1, Scene 1, Bacchanale, Three Graces,” is **Elissa Minet**, who we now know as Elissa Fuchs, ballerina extraordinaire, the same Elissa Fuchs who just celebrated her 100th birthday with a weekend of parties at FHW and with Greensboro's artistic community. Don was fortunate enough to have witnessed her great talent at the beginning of a long and distinguished career.

Of course, Don made a color copy of the bulletin for Elissa to keep, and either of them would be happy to tell you the whole story again, with better details, but isn't it nice to know that the world really isn't that big after all? Or it might be more accurate to say that we are all more connected to each other than we realize.

# Mrs. Cottontail and Friends provide pet therapy

Pushing an antique baby carriage down the hallway, the bubbly redhead could be mistaken for a doting mother visiting the health care center with her baby. But this is no baby, rather a 13-pound rabbit named **Sebastian**, and the bustling redhead is **Mrs. Cottontail**.

Each month, **Christi Eley**, founder of Mrs. Cottontail and Friends, visits the health care center and assisted living facilities at Friends Homes Guilford to offer pet therapy. With a tiered cart of bunny cages, Christi zips around the hallways stopping in households to visit. The loveable bunnies always come in costume and there is always a surprise: from Chinese robes to patriotic USA costumes, from Beatrix Potter's Peter Rabbit to party costumes.

"Sharing the bunnies with the residents is a great joy," Christi says. "I always look forward to seeing who will come out to



visit with the bunnies and the interesting conversations we will have as we discuss themes and trivia each month. The highlight is to watch the residents interact with the bunnies. Everyone has their own reaction, but the shared bond is how the bunnies bring us all together in a loving and calming way."

Christi grew up with a love of animals.

When she was a girl, Christi found a baby bunny in her grandfather's garden and raised it. Now she has a fluffle of her own. She leads the 4H Wasca Wabbits club in Winston Salem and shows rabbits. Christi takes her programs to schools, birthday parties and senior living communities throughout the area. She also does photo shoots where children can pose with her rabbits.

Friends Homes residents love to snuggle with the bunnies. With expressions of pure joy, residents can be seen sitting or rocking with a bunny in their lap.

"Everyone looks forward to the bunny visits," says **Mil Hendrix**, Activity Director of Guilford's Fry Hall Assisted Living. "Christi provides a very educational program as she highlights the theme for the month. After she introduces each bunny, she swaddles them and residents can rock them to sleep."

# Bobbie Reeves

**Bobbie Reeves** grew up in Greensboro and lived right down the street on Guida Drive. When it was time to go to college, Bobbie enrolled in Meredith College. She remembers at the time, most women went to college to be a nurse, a secretary or a teacher. She knew she didn't want to follow that "traditional" path and a trip home for a dental appointment changed her career path.

While speaking with the dental hygienist, Bobbie was informed that dental hygiene was a small but growing profession—only 3,300 in the country at that time. She learned of a new program at the University of North Carolina - Chapel Hill and enrolled and was one of only 15 students admitted to the program.

After earning a Bachelor of Science undergraduate degree in Dental Hygiene, she taught at what is now Guilford Technical Community College. Bobbie discovered she loved working with patients in a dental practice and did so for the remainder of her 40-year career.

Bobbie's first connection to Friends Homes Guilford was when her mother, **Artis Meeks**, became a resident in 1996. Artis remained a resident until her passing in 2003. One of the sweetest memories Bobbie has of her mother at that time was that FHG had a German Shepherd and the dog remained with her mother all day long until she passed.

A few years later, Bobbie's mother-in-law, **Julia Reeves**, became a Friends Home Guilford resident. Julia would always talk about sitting with her peers and socializing and how much fun that was.

Bobbie and her husband, **Jack**, moved to Sunset Beach, N.C.,



where they enjoyed life on a golf course and close proximity to beaches, friends and a fun social life.

Bobbie was on the waiting list at Friends Homes Guilford and called her sister, **Jerry**, to ask for the number to Friends Homes. She recalls that when she was reaching out to **Marie Brown**, her son showed up at her door saying, "I heard you wanted to move to Friends Homes." She let him know she had just been calling and he informed her that his wife already called and spoke with Marie and a room was ready!

Bobbie knew Friends Homes was on the radar, she just didn't think it was then. However, she feels very strongly that God had a hand in her moving and that His timing was perfect! Two months later, she moved to a cozy studio apartment in Woolman. She recalls the day she moved, surrounded by her children and grandchildren, she felt like she was back at Meredith College!

Bobbie can also brag that she lives on the same hall as her best friend since the eighth grade, and she is expecting the arrival of another lifelong friend to her hall in the coming months. If that wasn't enough, shortly after her move here, her sister and brother-in-law, **Al** and **Jerry Dew**, became residents at Friends Homes Guilford!

Bobbie will tell you that she feels she is meant to be at Friends Homes. When asked what she likes best about being here, without hesitation, she will tell you she loves being closer to her family. She has fully embraced life in this community since she moved in. She is a frequent and active participant in a variety of fitness classes, enjoys the cardio drumming, has been a "buddy" when her sister moved in, chair volleyball, and most of all socializing with her peers.

## Meet Eric Harrold & his hawks

Evidence suggests that falconry, the practice in which hawks, falcons, eagles and other birds of prey are trained to cooperatively hunt with a human companion, may have begun in ancient Mesopotamia as early as 2,000 BC. Among the nobles of medieval Europe, falconry was considered a status symbol, since it was largely restricted to the noble classes due to the necessary commitment of time, money and space. The “sport of kings” faded in popularity during the late 18th century, as firearms became the tool of choice for hunting.

But don't tell **Eric Harrold** that falconry is out of style. He will tell you that falconry has had a big impact on his life. He spends a lot of time outdoors, he's more aware of the natural world, and he has connections with amazing birds like **Joe Cool** and **Pistol**.

Joe Cool and Pistol are Harris hawks, sleek, well-conditioned, fairly tame, and with a look in their eyes like they're sizing you up. It takes someone with a lot of confidence to be a falconer; as one internet source said, this is not a sport suitable for children. When Eric and Joe Cool visited Friends Homes West in February, one could spot the connection between them. Eric spoke, and Joe Cool would cock his head and pay attention. Eric can speak knowledgeably about bird health, how to build the best house for hawks, how to feed them, and how to train them. He can tell stories about each bird he's worked with over the years, their personality and how he has interacted with them. But the best part is when the action moves outdoors.

Friends Homes is fortunate to have space outdoors between the two campuses, complete with meadows, a small stream, and a line of thick shrubs with small trees. It provides great cover for deer, rabbits and squirrels. When Eric returned 2 weeks later with both hawks and Ace, his Brittainy spaniel, beating the bushes with his long, bamboo pole, the deer promptly slipped away to continue their afternoon nap elsewhere, which was fine, since the hawks weren't interested in them anyway. The rabbits, however, gave them all a merry chase, and it was quite a treat to watch Joe Cool and Pistol watching the dog and following the movements in the grass, diving and hopping on the ground in hot pursuit. Unfortunately (or fortunately, depending on your point of view),

the rabbits disappeared down a rabbit hole, so the hawks came up empty-handed, but when Eric called them back to his truck and their tethers, they received a treat for putting on a good show.

We were all wondering if the hawks would come back to Eric; they seemed to be having such a good time swooping and soaring over our heads. But the connection brought them back. They work as a team, and it's beautiful to watch. Standing out in the field in the sunshine, listening to the hawks call to each other, it was easy to imagine living in an earlier time, when people and animals were more closely connected on a daily basis, and for a short time, we were all falconers.
